Present	Loving I saw the man loving.	Being loved I saw the man being loved.
Future	Going to love; about to love I saw the man about to run.	Going to be loved; about to be loved I saw the man about to be loved
Perfect	Having loved I saw the man having loved.	Having been loved I saw the man having been loved.

Present	1st prin. part. stem + long vowel + ns, ntis (3rd decl. adj. endings) “-----ing”	NO FORMS IN LATIN
Future	4th prin. part. stem +UR + -us, -a, -um “going to _____” OR “about to _____”	1st prin. part. stem + long vowel + ND + -us, -a, -um “going to be _____-ed” “about to be _____-ed”
Perfect	NO FORMS IN LATIN	4th prin part. stem + -us, -a, -um “having been _____-ed”
