

Even larger numbers!

Work out how to read larger numbers by grouping into sets of three.

Each block or set of three is hundreds, tens and units, which keep repeating themselves.

The first block of three are just hundreds tens and units.

So 678 is six hundred and seventy eight.

The second block of three are thousands.

So 678 678 is six hundred and seventy eight thousand six hundred and seventy eight.

The third block of three are millions.

So 678 678 678 is six hundred and seventy eight million, six hundred and seventy eight thousand and six hundred and seventy eight.

Each set of three (hundreds tens and units) is read as a block, the second set being thousands and the third set being millions.
