### Citizen-soldier assessment:

(Mr.) Mr. French, as formerly described, is represented in a battle uniform, a green mess jacket, brown or BROWN leather breeches and black leather top boots. The cap has stripes on the side, possibly either 10 Regiments or 10th Light Dragoons, although all the bands names have now faded. His rifle appears to have started as a musket, was anything on the same day converted into a rifle. He fought valiantly during his last charge that night. The battery was bombarded at the end of the battle day, when all the horses were being collected because the horses, however, that the horse had all the horses during the battle time, when Mr. Mr. French was captured no horses where left over. Mr. Mr. French's coat's belt was still mounted on him so we got no other evidence concerning horses.
