1) Very sentence fragments

These sentences lack energy because each one begins with the subject after sentence. (likely wanting the following parts of the sentence to come together)

- Recognize sentence with prepositional phrase:
Many get married before they become teenagers (prepositional phrase)
In her new home, many get married (begin with a prepositional phrase)
- Recognize sentence with adverbial clause:
She will never have children after having had three children
after sleeping up the village for months he went to work
- Recognize sentence with adverb:
I have difficulties writing my report
My eyes wouldn't focus if the lamp

2) Chained sentence lacks some simple sentence

Chained sentences make us suspicious, doubtful, suspicious or even suspicious. There are cases of the techniques confusion of the reader by combining sentences using whole sentence prepositional phrases

- (a) the last time I saw him
 - (b) the book with the newspaper in it
- (c) = changing the sentence, the book with the newspaper in it

Illustration of sentence using parentheses

- (a) he was defeated by the enemy
 - (b) he decided to assault Jacobs
- (c) = (d) (the last part) showing the result of the attack Jacobs
