

The Ancient Olympic Games

The First Olympic Games were held in the year 776 BC in Olympia, Greece and continued there every 4 years till 393 AD. These games were held in honour of the god Zeus and His Brothers King Pelops. There were only 300 athletes in the ancient Olympic Games and they came only from Greece.

The events were:

- Equestrian events:
 - Chariot racing
 - Javelin
- Boxing
- Wrestling
- Pentathlon. This event was a combination of Boxing and wrestling. Pentathletes compete in these five parts:
 - Discus
 - Javelin
 - Jump
 - Running
 - Wrestling

An Olympic winner was crowned with a olive wreath and his name was written in the official Olympic Records book.

After the Ottoman Empire captured power in Greece, their Emperor Theodore closed the Olympic Games in 1829 AD saying the Greeks were too pagan.

The Modern Olympic Games started only in 1896.
