Week One: Map and Globe Skills (review) TEKS 6AB

- Compare/contrast a map (a drawing showing features of an area) and a globe (a round model of the Earth): How are they alike? How are they different?
- Interpret maps and construct maps using geographic tools
 - o Map title tells what a map is about
 - o Map key or map legend tells what the symbols on a map stand for
 - o Symbol small drawing or a color that stands for something on the map
 - <u>Compass rose</u> a pointer that shows the cardinal directions; may also show intermediate directions
 - o Cardinal directions north, south, east, and west
 - o <u>Intermediate directions</u> northeast, northwest, southeast, and southwest
 - o Scale helps measure distances on a map
 - <u>Grid system</u> a system of horizontal and vertical lines that can help find locations on a map
- Refer to p. H12-H14 for examples and descriptions of the map features listed above.
- Guide students in using the maps on pH12-H14, as well as maps on other textbook pages and worksheets, to practice interpreting maps and applying map skills
 - o See "Map Adventure" on p14 and p42 for further practice.
