A Trip to the Moon

In 1969, NASA launched the Apollo 11 mission, which became one of the most historic space missions ever. The spacecraft carried three astronauts: Neil Armstrong, Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin, and Michael Collins. Their goal was to land on the Moon and return safely to Earth.

On July 20, 1969, Neil Armstrong became the first human to step onto the lunar surface.
